Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3694) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 1999 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 3694) to authorize appropriations
3 for fiscal year 1999 for intelligence and intelligence-relat-
4 ed activities of the United States Government, the Com-
5 munity Management Account, and the Central Intelligence
6 Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other
7 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
8 with. Points of order against consideration of the bill for
9 failure to comply with clause 2(1)(6) of rule XI are waived.
10 General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not
11 exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the
12 chairman and ranking minority member of the Permanent
13 Select Committee on intelligence. After general debate the
14 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
15 minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original
16 bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute
17 rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-
18 ommended by the Permanent Select Committee on Intel-
19 ligence now printed in the bill, modified by striking section
20 401 (and redesignating succeeding sections accordingly).
21 That amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be
22 considered by title rather than by section. Each title shall
23 be considered as read. Points of order against that amend-
24 ment in the nature of a substitute for failure to comply
25 with clause 7 of rule XVI or clause 5(b) of rule XXI are

1 waived. No amendment to that amendment in the nature
2 of a substitute shall be in order unless printed in the por-
3 tion of the Congressional Record designated for that pur-
4 pose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Printed amendments shall
5 be considered as read. The chairman of the Committee
6 of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further
7 consideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for
8 a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five
9 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any
10 postponed question that follows another electronic vote
11 without intervening business, provided that the minimum
12 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-
13 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-
14 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
15 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
16 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a
17 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted
18 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or the amend-
19 ment in the nature of a substitute made in order as origi-
20 nal text. The previous question shall be considered as or-
21 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
22 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
23 with or without instructions.

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
