Mr. SOLOMON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 2) proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States with respect to the number of terms of office of Members of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 2) proposing an

1 amendment to the Constitution of the United States with  
2 respect to the number of terms of office of Members of  
3 the Senate and the House of Representatives. The first  
4 reading of the joint resolution shall be dispensed with.  
5 General debate shall be confined to the joint resolution  
6 and shall not exceed two hours equally divided and con-  
7 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of  
8 the Committee on the Judiciary. After general debate the  
9 joint resolution shall be considered for amendment under  
10 the five-minute rule. The joint resolution shall be consid-  
11 ered as read. No amendment shall be in order except those  
12 specified in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-  
13 panying this resolution. Each amendment may be offered  
14 only in the order specified in the report, may be offered  
15 only by a Member designated in the report, may be consid-  
16 ered notwithstanding the adoption of a previous amend-  
17 ment in the nature of a substitute, shall be considered as  
18 read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the report  
19 of the Committee on Rules equally divided and controlled  
20 by the proponent and an opponent, and shall not be sub-  
21 ject to amendment. If more than one amendment is adopt-  
22 ed, then only the one receiving the greater number of af-  
23 firmative votes shall be considered as finally adopted. In  
24 the case of a tie for the greater number of affirmative

1 votes, then only the last amendment to receive that num-  
2 ber of affirmative votes shall be considered as finally  
3 adopted. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole  
4 may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-  
5 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-  
6 corded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five  
7 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any  
8 postponed question that follows another electronic vote  
9 without intervening business, provided that the minimum  
10 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-  
11 tion shall be fifteen minutes. At the conclusion of consider-  
12 ation of the joint resolution for amendment the Committee  
13 shall rise and report the joint resolution to the House with  
14 such amendment as may have been finally adopted. The  
15 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the  
16 joint resolution and any amendment thereto to final pas-  
17 sage without intervening motion except one motion to re-  
18 commit with or without instructions.
