Mr. LATOURETTE (for himself and Mr. COSTELLO) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Book Festival.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**
4 **GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL BOOK FESTIVAL.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Library of Congress (in this
6 resolution referred to as the “sponsor”), in cooperation
7 with the First Lady, may sponsor the National Book Fes-
8 tival (in this resolution referred to as the “event”) on the
9 Capitol Grounds.

1 (b) DATE OF EVENT.—The event shall be held on
2 September 21, 2002, or on such other date as the Speaker
3 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
4 Rules and Administration of the Senate jointly designate.

5 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed
7 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
8 Board, the event shall be—

9 (1) free of admission charge and open to the
10 public; and

11 (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of
12 Congress.

13 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
14 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
15 incident to all activities associated with the event.

16 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

17 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
18 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may
19 cause to be placed on the Capitol Grounds such stage,
20 seating, booths, sound amplification and video devices, and
21 other related structures and equipment as may be required
22 for the event, including equipment for the broadcast of
23 the event over radio, television, and other media outlets.

24 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
25 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board may make any

1 additional arrangements as may be required to carry out
2 the event.

3 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

4 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
5 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
6 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
7 cerning sales, displays, advertisements, and solicitations
8 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
9 cable to the Capitol Grounds in connection with the event.
