Mr. ENGLISH (for himself, Ms. HART, and Mr. RYUN of Kansas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations, and in addition to the Committee on Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit the exportation of Alaskan North Slope crude oil.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON EXPORTATION OF ALASKAN**
4 **NORTH SLOPE CRUDE OIL.**

5 Effective 90 days after the date of the enactment of
6 this Act—

7 (1) no domestically produced crude oil trans-
8 ported by pipeline over right-of-way granted pursu-
9 ant to section 203 of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Au-

1 thorization Act (43 U.S.C. 1652) may be exported
2 from the United States, or any commonwealth, terri-
3 tory, or possession of the United States; and

4 (2) subsections (s) and (u) of section 28 of the
5 Mineral Leasing Act of 1920 (30 U.S.C. 185(s) and
6 (u)), and section 7(d) of the Export Administration
7 Act of 1979 (50 U.S.C. App. 2406(d)), are repealed.

8 **SEC. 2. ENFORCEMENT.**

9 The President may, notwithstanding section 202 of
10 the International Emergency Economic Powers Act, exer-
11 cise the authorities he has under sections 203 and 205
12 of that Act to carry out the prohibition under section 1
13 of this Act, and the penalties provided in section 206 of
14 the International Emergency Economic Powers Act shall
15 apply to violations under this Act.
