Mr. LARSEN of Washington (for himself, Mr. DICKS, Mr. INSLEE, and Mr. SMITH of Washington) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to engage in certain feasibility studies of water resource projects in the State of Washington.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Pacific Northwest Fea-
5 sibility Studies Act of 2001”.

6 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF FEASIBILITY STUDIES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior may
8 engage in the following feasibility studies:

1 (1) The Tulalip Tribes Water Quality Feasi-
2 bility Study, to identify ways to meet future domes-
3 tic and commercial water distribution needs of the
4 Tulalip Indian Reservation on the Eastern Shore of
5 Puget Sound, Washington.

6 (2) The Lower Elwha Klallam Rural Water
7 Supply Feasibility Study, to identify additional
8 groundwater supply sources for the Lower Elwha In-
9 dian Reservation on the Olympic Peninsula, Wash-
10 ington.

11 (3) The Makah Community Water Source
12 Project Feasibility Study, to identify ways to meet
13 the current and future domestic and commercial
14 water supply and distribution needs of the Makah
15 Indian Tribe on the Olympic Peninsula, Washington.

16 (b) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF RESULTS.—The Sec-
17 retary of the Interior shall make available to the public,
18 upon request, the results of each feasibility study author-
19 ized under subsection (a), and shall promptly publish in
20 the Federal Register a notice of the availability of those
21 results.
