A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to engage in certain feasibility studies of water resource projects in the State of Washington.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Pacific Northwest Fea-
3 sibility Studies Act of 2001”.

4 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF FEASIBILITY STUDIES.**

5 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The Secretary of the Interior may
6 engage in the following feasibility studies:

7 (1) The Tulalip Tribes Water Quality Feasi-
8 bility Study, to identify ways to meet future domes-
9 tic and commercial water distribution needs of the
10 Tulalip Indian Reservation on the Eastern Shore of
11 Puget Sound, Washington.

12 (2) The Lower Elwha Klallam Rural Water
13 Supply Feasibility Study, to identify additional
14 groundwater supply sources for the Lower Elwha In-
15 dian Reservation on the Olympic Peninsula, Wash-
16 ington.

17 (3) The Makah Community Water Source
18 Project Feasibility Study, to identify ways to meet
19 the current and future domestic and commercial
20 water supply and distribution needs of the Makah
21 Indian Tribe on the Olympic Peninsula, Washington.

22 (b) **PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF RESULTS.**—The Sec-
23 retary of the Interior shall make available to the public,
24 upon request, the results of each feasibility study author-
25 ized under subsection (a), and shall promptly publish in

1 the Federal Register a notice of the availability of those
2 results.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Pacific Northwest Feasi-*
5 *bility Studies Act of 2001”.*

6 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF FEASIBILITY STUDIES.**

7 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—*The Secretary of the Interior may*
8 *engage in the following feasibility studies:*

9 (1) *The Tulalip Tribes Water Quality Feasibility*
10 *Study, to identify ways to meet future domestic and*
11 *commercial water distribution needs of the Tulalip*
12 *Indian Reservation on the Eastern Shore of Puget*
13 *Sound, Washington.*

14 (2) *The Lower Elwha Klallam Rural Water*
15 *Supply Feasibility Study, to identify additional*
16 *rural water supply sources for the Lower Elwha In-*
17 *Indian Reservation on the Olympic Peninsula, Wash-*
18 *ington.*

19 (3) *The Makah Community Water Source Project*
20 *Feasibility Study, to identify ways to meet the cur-*
21 *rent and future domestic and commercial water sup-*
22 *ply and distribution needs of the Makah Indian Tribe*
23 *on the Olympic Peninsula, Washington.*

24 (b) *PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF RESULTS.*—*The Sec-*
25 *retary of the Interior shall make available to the public,*

- 1 *upon request, the results of each feasibility study authorized*
- 2 *under subsection (a), and shall promptly publish in the*
- 3 *Federal Register a notice of the availability of those results.*
