Mr. EVANS (for himself and Mr. REYES) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Appropriations

A BILL

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2001 for the Department of Veterans Affairs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Veterans Benefits Ad-
5 ministration Emergency Supplemental Appropriations
6 Act, 2001”.

7 **SEC. 2. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS.**

8 The following sums are appropriated, out of any
9 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-
10 vide supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2001:

1 DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

2 DEPARTMENTAL ADMINISTRATION

3 GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSES

4 For an additional amount for “General Operating
5 Expenses”, \$29,100,000, of which \$26,600,000 shall be
6 for costs associated with the processing of claims for com-
7 pensation and pension benefits, and of which \$2,500,000
8 shall be for costs associated with the processing of claims
9 for education benefits: *Provided*, That such amount is des-
10 ignated by the Congress as an emergency requirement
11 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget
12 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985: *Provided fur-*
13 *ther*, That such amount shall be available only to the ex-
14 tent that an official budget request, that includes designa-
15 tion of the entire amount of the request as an emergency
16 requirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emer-
17 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, is transmitted by the
18 President to the Congress.
