Ms. EDDIE BERNICE JOHNSON of Texas introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

A BILL

To amend the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 to authorize the provision of education and related services to law enforcement and military personnel of foreign countries to prevent and control HIV/AIDS and tuberculosis.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EDUCATION AND RELATED SERVICES TO FOR-**
2 **IGN LAW ENFORCEMENT AND MILITARY**
3 **PERSONNEL TO PREVENT AND CONTROL HIV/**
4 **AIDS AND TUBERCULOSIS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 104(c) of the Foreign As-
6 sistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2151b(c)) is amended by
7 adding at the end the following:

8 “(8)(A) In providing assistance under paragraphs (4)
9 through (7), the Administrator of the United States Agen-
10 cy for International Development is authorized, notwith-
11 standing section 660 of this Act, to provide education and
12 related services to law enforcement and military personnel
13 of foreign countries to prevent and control HIV/AIDS and
14 tuberculosis.

15 “(B) Education and related services described in sub-
16 paragraph (A) may be provided pursuant to subparagraph
17 (A) only if the Administrator determines that—

18 “(i) the education and related services are part
19 of a health initiative under one or more of para-
20 graphs (4) through (7) in the foreign country in-
21 volved;

22 “(ii) failure to provide the education and re-
23 lated services to law enforcement and military per-
24 sonnel of the foreign country would impair the
25 achievement of the overall objectives of the health
26 initiative;

1 “(iii) the education and related services are the
2 same or are similar to the education and related
3 services to be provided under the health initiative to
4 other population groups in the foreign country; and

5 “(iv) none of the education and related services,
6 including any commodity, can be readily adapted for
7 law enforcement, military, or internal security func-
8 tions.”.

9 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
10 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to education and
11 related services to law enforcement and military personnel
12 of foreign countries to prevent and control HIV/AIDS and
13 tuberculosis provided beginning before, on, or after the
14 date of the enactment of this Act.

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
