# H. R. 2199

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## **A BILL**

To amend the National Capital Revitalization and Self-Government Improvement Act of 1997 to permit any Federal law enforcement agency to enter into a cooperative agreement with the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia to assist the Department in carrying out crime prevention and law enforcement activities in the District of Columbia if deemed appropriate by the Chief of the Department and the United States Attorney for the District of Columbia, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        This Act may be cited as the “District of Columbia  
5 Police Coordination Amendment Act of 2001”.

6 **SEC. 2. PERMITTING ADDITIONAL FEDERAL LAW ENFORCE-**  
7 **MENT AGENCIES TO ENTER INTO COOPERA-**  
8 **TIVE AGREEMENTS WITH METROPOLITAN**  
9 **POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF**  
10 **COLUMBIA.**

11        Section 11712(d) of the National Capital Revitaliza-  
12 tion and Self-Government Improvement Act of 1997 (D.C.  
13 Code, sec. 4–192(d)) is amended by adding at the end the  
14 following:

15            “(33) Any other law enforcement agency of the  
16 Federal government that the Chief of the Metropoli-  
17 tan Police Department and the United States Attor-  
18 ney for the District of Columbia deem appropriate to  
19 enter into an agreement pursuant to this section.”.

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
