Mr. BURTON of Indiana (for himself and Mrs. MORELLA) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform

A BILL

To provide that Federal employees may retain for personal use promotional items received as a result of travel taken in the course of employment.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RETENTION OF TRAVEL PROMOTIONAL ITEMS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5702 of title 5, United
5 States Code, is amended—

6 (1) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-
7 section (d);

8 (2) in subsection (d) (as redesignated by para-
9 graph (1)), by striking “This section does” and in-
10 serting “Subsections (a) and (b) do”; and

1 (3) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-
2 lowing new subsection:

3 “(c) Promotional items (including frequent flyer
4 miles, upgrades, and access to carrier clubs or facilities)
5 an employee receives as a result of using travel or trans-
6 portation services procured by the United States or ac-
7 cepted pursuant to section 1353 of title 31 may be re-
8 tained by the employee for personal use if such pro-
9 motional items are obtained under the same terms as
10 those offered to the general public and at no additional
11 cost to the Government.”.

12 (b) REPEAL OF SUPERCEDED LAW.—Section 6008 of
13 the Federal Acquisition Streamlining Act of 1994 (Public
14 Law 103–355; 5 U.S.C. 5702 note) is repealed.

15 (c) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by this
16 Act shall apply with respect to promotional items received
17 before, on, or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
