A BILL

To reauthorize the trade adjustment assistance program under the Trade Act of 1974.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REAUTHORIZATION OF TRADE ADJUSTMENT**
4 **ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.**

5 (a) ASSISTANCE FOR WORKERS.—Section 245 of the
6 Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2317) is amended by strik-
7 ing “October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 2001,”
8 each place it appears and inserting “October 1, 2001, and
9 ending September 30, 2003,”.

1 (b) ASSISTANCE FOR FIRMS.—Section 256(b) of the
2 Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2346(b)) is amended by
3 striking “October 1, 1998, and ending September 30,
4 2001” and inserting “October 1, 2001, and ending Sep-
5 tember 30, 2003,”.

6 (c) TERMINATION.—Section 285(c) of the Trade Act
7 of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2771 note) is amended in paragraphs
8 (1) and (2)(A) by striking “September 30, 2001” and in-
9 serting “September 30, 2003”.

10 (d) TRAINING LIMITATION UNDER NAFTA PRO-
11 GRAM.—Section 250(d)(2) of the Trade Act of 1974 (19
12 U.S.C. 2330(d)(2)) is amended by striking “October 1,
13 1998, and ending September 30, 2001” and inserting
14 “October 1, 2001, and ending September 30, 2003”.

15 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
16 this section shall take effect on October 1, 2001.
