A BILL

To require the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security to establish a site on the Internet through which individuals may provide information on suspicious activities that may be used by the Federal Bureau of Investigation or other Government entities in the war on terrorism or to protect homeland security.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “911.Gov Act of 2001”.

1 **SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT TO ESTABLISH WWW.911.GOV SITE**
2 **ON THE INTERNET.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Assistant to the President for
4 Homeland Security shall establish a site on the Internet,
5 the purpose of which shall be to provide—

6 (1) a means through which individuals may
7 submit information on suspicious activities that may
8 be used by the Federal Bureau of Investigation or
9 other Government entities in the war on terrorism or
10 to protect homeland security; and

11 (2) a single location at which may be found a
12 direct connection to all other Internet sites estab-
13 lished by Federal agencies for reporting such sus-
14 picious activities.

15 (b) DOMAIN NAME.—The Assistant to the President
16 for Homeland Security shall take such action as necessary
17 to ensure that the domain name for the site required by
18 subsection (a) is www.911.gov.

19 (c) HOMELAND SECURITY DEFINED.—As used in
20 this Act, the term “homeland security” means the protec-
21 tion of the territory, critical infrastructure, and citizens
22 of the United States by Federal, State, and local govern-
23 ment entities from the threat or use of chemical, biologi-
24 cal, radiological, nuclear, cyber, or conventional weapons
25 by military or other means.
