## A BILL

To revise the boundary of the Glen Canyon National Recreation Area in the States of Utah and Arizona.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Glen Canyon National  
5 Recreation Area Boundary Revision Act of 2002”.

6 **SEC. 2. GLEN CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA**  
7 **BOUNDARY REVISION.**

8       (a) IN GENERAL.—The first section of Public Law  
9 92–593 (86 Stat. 1311) is amended—

1           (1) by striking “That in” and inserting “SEC-  
2           TION 1. (a) In”; and

3           (2) by adding at the end the following:

4           “(b) In addition to the boundary change authority  
5 under subsection (a), the Secretary may acquire approxi-  
6 mately 152 acres of private land in exchange for approxi-  
7 mately 370 acres of land within the boundary of Glen Can-  
8 yon National Recreation Area, as generally depicted on the  
9 map entitled “Page One Land Exchange Proposal”, num-  
10 ber 608/60573–2001, and dated November 11, 2001. The  
11 map shall be on file and available for public inspection  
12 in the appropriate offices of the National Park Service.”.

13           (b) CHANGE IN ACREAGE CEILING.—Such section is  
14 further amended by striking “one million two hundred and  
15 thirty-six thousand eight hundred and eighty acres” and  
16 inserting “1,256,000 acres”.
