Mr. PETERSON of Minnesota (for himself, Mr. OBERSTAR, and Mr. SANDERS) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To amend title 32, United States Code, to end the prohibition against overtime pay for National Guard technicians.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF PROHIBITION AGAINST OVERTIME**
4 **PAY FOR NATIONAL GUARD TECHNICIANS.**

5 (a) **AUTHORITY FOR SECRETARY TO GRANT OVER-**
6 **TIME PAY.**—Section 709(h) of title 32, United States
7 Code, is amended by striking the second sentence and in-
8 serting “In the case of a technician who performs irregular
9 or overtime work, the Secretary concerned shall, in the

1 Secretary's discretion, either (1) grant the technician an
2 amount of compensatory time off from the technician's
3 scheduled tour of duty equal to the amount of time spent
4 in such irregular or overtime work, or (2) pay the techni-
5 cian for such irregular or overtime work at a rate equal
6 to one and one-half times the rate of basic pay applicable
7 to the technician."

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to irregular or over-
10 time work performed by an employee subject to section
11 709 of title 32, United States Code, on or after the date
12 of the enactment of this Act.
