Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 581) to authorize the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to use funds appropriated for wildland fire management in the Department of the Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2001, to reimburse the United States Fish and Wildlife Service and the National Marine Fisheries Service to facilitate the interagency cooperation required under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 in connection with wildland fire management.

Mr. HASTINGS of Washington, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 581) to authorize the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to use funds appropriated for wildland fire management in the Department of the Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2001, to reimburse the United States Fish and Wildlife Service and the National Marine Fisheries Service to facilitate the interagency cooperation required under the Endangered Spe-

cies Act of 1973 in connection with wildland fire management.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 581) to authorize the Secretary of
6 the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to use funds
7 appropriated for wildland fire management in the Depart-
8 ment of the Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations
9 Act, 2001, to reimburse the United States Fish and Wild-
10 life Service and the National Marine Fisheries Service to
11 facilitate the interagency cooperation required under the
12 Endangered Species Act of 1973 in connection with
13 wildland fire management. The first reading of the bill
14 shall be dispensed with. Points of order against consider-
15 ation of the bill for failure to comply with section 311 of
16 the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General
17 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed
18 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman
19 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Re-
20 sources. After general debate the bill shall be considered
21 for amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill shall
22 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-
23 sions in the bill are waived. During consideration of the
24 bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of

1 the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the basis
2 of whether the Member offering an amendment has caused
3 it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional Record
4 designated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII.
5 Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. At
6 the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment
7 the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House
8 with such amendments as may have been adopted. The
9 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
10 bill and amendments thereto to final passage without in-
11 tervening motion except one motion to recommit with or
12 without instructions.

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
