Ms. PRYCE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4687) to provide for the establishment of investigative teams to assess building performance and emergency response and evacuation procedures in the wake of any building failure that has resulted in substantial loss of life or that posed significant potential of substantial loss of life.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 4687) to provide for the establish-  
3 ment of investigative teams to assess building performance  
4 and emergency response and evacuation procedures in the  
5 wake of any building failure that has resulted in substan-  
6 tial loss of life or that posed significant potential of sub-  
7 stantial loss of life. The first reading of the bill shall be  
8 dispensed with. General debate shall be confined to the  
9 bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-  
10 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of  
11 the Committee on Science. After general debate the bill  
12 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute  
13 rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill  
14 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule  
15 the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended  
16 by the Committee on Science now printed in the bill. Each  
17 section of the committee amendment in the nature of a  
18 substitute shall be considered as read. All points of order  
19 against the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-  
20 stitute are waived. During consideration of the bill for  
21 amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole  
22 may accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether  
23 the Member offering an amendment has caused it to be  
24 printed in the portion of the Congressional Record des-  
25 ignated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amend-

1 ments so printed shall be considered as read. At the con-  
2 clusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the  
3 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with  
4 such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member  
5 may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-  
6 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill  
7 or to the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-  
8 stitute. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
9 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage  
10 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit  
11 with or without instructions.
