Providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Seventh Congress.

1 *Resolved,*

1 **SECTION 1. COMMITTEE EXPENSES FOR THE ONE HUN-**
2 **DRED SEVENTH CONGRESS.**

3 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—With respect to the One Hundred
4 Seventh Congress, there shall be paid out of the applicable
5 accounts of the House of Representatives, in accordance
6 with this primary expense resolution, not more than the
7 amount specified in subsection (b) for the expenses (includ-
8 ing the expenses of all staff salaries) of each committee
9 named in that subsection.

8 **SEC. 5. REGULATIONS.**

9 *Amounts made available under this resolution shall be*
10 *expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by the*
11 *Committee on House Administration.*

12 **SEC. 6. ADJUSTMENT AUTHORITY.**

13 *The Committee on House Administration shall have*
14 *authority to make adjustments in amounts under section*
15 *1, if necessary to comply with an order of the President*
16 *issued under section 254 of the Balanced Budget and Emer-*
17 *gency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or to conform to any re-*
18 *duction in appropriations for the purposes of such section*
19 *1.*
