A BILL

To extend by two years the Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards Program of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Chemical Facility Anti-
5 Terrorism Standards Program Extension Act”.
