## RESOLUTION

Providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Eighteenth Congress.

1      *Resolved,*

1 **SECTION 1. COMMITTEE EXPENSES FOR THE ONE HUN-**  
2 **DRED EIGHTEENTH CONGRESS.**

3 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—With respect to the One Hundred  
4 Eighteenth Congress, there shall be paid out of the applica-  
5 ble accounts of the House of Representatives, in accordance  
6 with this primary expense resolution, not more than the  
7 amount specified in subsection (b) for the expenses (includ-  
8 ing the expenses of all staff salaries) of each committee  
9 named in such subsection.

10 (b) *COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.*—The committees and  
11 amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee on Ag-

 11 *than the amount specified in such subsection shall be avail-*  
 12 *able for expenses incurred during the period beginning at*  
 13 *noon on January 3, 2024, and ending immediately before*  
 14 *noon on January 3, 2025.*

11 **SEC. 4. VOUCHERS.**

12 *Payments under this resolution shall be made on*  
13 *vouchers authorized by the committee involved, signed by*  
14 *the chair of such committee, and approved in the manner*  
15 *directed by the Committee on House Administration.*

16 **SEC. 5. REGULATIONS.**

17 *Amounts made available under this resolution shall be*  
18 *expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by the*  
19 *Committee on House Administration.*

20 **SEC. 6. RESERVE FUND FOR UNANTICIPATED EXPENSES.**

21 *(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is hereby established a*  
22 *reserve fund for unanticipated expenses of committees for*  
23 *the One Hundred Eighteenth Congress.*

24 *(b) AMOUNT.—The reserve fund under this section*  
25 *shall have a balance of \$18,000,000, of which—*

1           (1) \$9,000,000 shall be available for unantici-  
2           pated expenses incurred during the period beginning  
3           at noon on January 3, 2023, and ending immediately  
4           before noon on January 3, 2024; and

5           (2) \$9,000,000 shall be available for unantici-  
6           pated expenses incurred during the period beginning  
7           at noon on January 3, 2024, and ending immediately  
8           before noon on January 3, 2025.

9           (c) *ALLOCATION TO COMMITTEES.*—Amounts in the re-  
10          serve fund under this section shall be paid to a committee  
11          pursuant to an allocation approved by the Committee on  
12          House Administration.

13       **SEC. 7. ADJUSTMENT AUTHORITY.**

14          *The Committee on House Administration shall have*  
15          *authority to make adjustments in amounts under section*  
16          *1, if necessary to comply with an order of the President*  
17          *issued under section 251A or 254 of the Balanced Budget*  
18          *and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or to conform*  
19          *to any change in appropriations for the purposes of such*  
20          *section 1.*
