A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to expand the advanced manufacturing production credit to include black mass.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Critical Minerals Inde-
5 pendence Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF ADVANCED MANUFACTURING PRO-**
7 **DUCTION CREDIT TO INCLUDE BLACK MASS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 45X(c)(5) of the Internal
9 Revenue Code of 1986 is amended—

1 (1) in subparagraph (A), by adding at the end
2 the following new clause:

3 “(iv) Black mass.”, and

4 (2) in subparagraph (B), by adding at the end
5 the following new clause:

6 “(iv) BLACK MASS.—The term ‘black
7 mass’ means the intermediate, solid partic-
8 ulate material produced by the mechanical
9 or pyrometallurgical processing of spent
10 lithium-ion or similar electrochemical cells,
11 consisting predominantly of finely divided
12 cathode and anode active materials, includ-
13 ing lithium, nickel, cobalt, manganese, and
14 graphite, prior to any hydrometallurgical
15 or chemical purification that isolates indi-
16 vidual metals or compounds.”.

17 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
18 this section shall apply to components produced and sold
19 in taxable years beginning after December 31, 2024.

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
