Mr. THOMPSON of Mississippi (for himself, Mr. SWALWELL, Mr. THANEDAR, Mr. GOLDMAN of New York, Mr. KENNEDY of New York, Mrs. McIVER, Ms. POU, Mr. CARTER of Louisiana, and Mr. GREEN of Texas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to improve the transparency of the Nonprofit Security Grant Program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Nonprofit Security
5 Grant Program Transparency Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORTS UNDER THE NONPROFIT SECURITY**
2 **GRANT PROGRAM.**

3 Subsection (e) of section 2009 of the Homeland Secu-
4 rity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 609a) is amended to read as
5 follows:

6 “(e) REPORTS.—

7 “(1) PRE-GRANT INFORMATION.—Not later
8 than seven days before the Administrator makes in
9 a fiscal year a set of one or more grants under this
10 section, the Administrator shall submit to the Com-
11 mittee on Homeland Security of the House of Rep-
12 resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Secu-
13 rity and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report
14 that includes information relating to the following:

15 “(A) The number of applications in such
16 year for such a grant, submitted to a State by
17 an eligible nonprofit organization described in
18 subsection (b).

19 “(B) The number of such applications sub-
20 mitted to the Administrator by any such State.

21 “(C) The number of grants to be so made
22 in such set, disaggregated by the following cat-
23 egories:

24 “(i) State.

25 “(ii) High-risk urban area (as applica-
26 ble).

1 “(D) The aggregate amount of such grants
2 in such set, disaggregated by such categories.

3 “(E) For each such organization that is to
4 receive a grant in such set, the following:

5 “(i) The name of such organization.

6 “(ii) The address of such organiza-
7 tion, including the State in which such or-
8 ganization is located.

9 “(iii) Whether such organization is lo-
10 cated in a high-risk urban area and, if so,
11 the identification of such area.

12 “(iv) The amount of such grant.

13 “(2) ANNUAL INFORMATION.—Not later than
14 90 days after the conclusion of a fiscal year in which
15 a grant is made under this section, the Adminis-
16 trator shall submit to the committees specified in
17 paragraph (1) a report that includes information re-
18 lating to the following for such year:

19 “(A) For each State through which an eli-
20 gible nonprofit organization described in sub-
21 section (b) applied to receive such a grant, the
22 following:

23 “(i) The number of applications for
24 such a grant, submitted to such State by
25 such an organization.

1 “(ii) The number of such applications
2 submitted to the Administrator by such
3 State.

4 “(iii) The number of such grants
5 made.

6 “(iv) The aggregate amount of such
7 grants.

8 “(v) Of such amounts, each amount
9 retained under subsection (c)(2).

10 “(B) For each recipient of such a grant,
11 the expenditure by such recipient of the amount
12 of such grant not so retained.

13 “(C) For each high-risk urban area in
14 which such a recipient is located, the following:

15 “(i) The number of such grants made.

16 “(ii) The aggregate amount of such
17 grants.

18 “(D) The operations of the program office
19 of the Program, including staffing resources
20 and efforts with respect to subparagraphs (A)
21 through (D) of subsection (c)(1).”.

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
