WILLIAM HUGHES KLEIN, Sr., when interviewed by Special Agents DOWNING and PETERSON on March 3, 1965, advised as follows:

KLEIN is a native of this area and has been employed as a plumber for many years. He said he is extremely anti-Communist and spends a considerable amount of his time reading anti-Communist literature and discussing this with his associates. He said he is extremely upset over the Communist menace to this country and feels that the United States will soon be taken over by the Communists internally unless a trend in this direction is changed.

Regarding the "Minutemen" KLEIN claimed his only knowledge of this organization is what he has obtained from radio programs and the local press. He said he does
