POLICY

DOD ENEMY PW/DETAINEE PROGRAM

1. PURPOSE: To assign responsibilities within the DIA for implementation of the DoD Program for Prisoners of War and Other Detainees.

2. REFERENCE: DoD Directive 5100.69, "DoD Program for Prisoners of War and Other Detainees (Short Title: DoD Enemy PW/Detainee Program), 27 December 1972.

3. APPLICABILITY: This regulation applies to all DIA elements.

4. SUPERSESSION: This regulation supersedes DIAR 60-19, 27 April 1973.

5. RESPONSIBILITIES:

a. The Directorate for Research (DB), (Directorate for Attaches and Training (AT), Directorate for Collection Management (DC), and Directorate for Resources and Systems (RS) collaboration)

DISTRIBUTION D&G

(1) Provide appropriate information from the Intelligence Community regarding policies and activities of foreign powers concerning nationals in the custody of U.S. or Allied Forces.

(2) Provide evaluated analysis of enemy forces, actions of external threat to prisoners of war/civilian internee (PW/CI) camps or other facilities utilized to intern capture or detained personnel.

b. RS (DB, DC and AT collaboration)

(1) Provide evaluated analysis of enemy organization and policies designed to disrupt PW camp operations through acts of sedition or other attempts for disorder by enemy PW/CI interned or otherwise in U.S. forces custody.

(2) Provide coordination of all intelligence/counterintelligence aspects of the DoD PW/Detainee Program with other DoD components and Federal departments and agencies concerned.
