

PART II
NARRATIVE (U)

(U) Fleet Intelligence Center Pacific (FICPAC) is a shore activity located at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, and under the administrative control of Commander in Chief U. S. Pacific Fleet (CINCPACFLT). FICPAC is subject to the area coordination authority of Commander, Naval Base Pearl Harbor. The Commanding Officer is Captain Jeremy C. CLARK, USN.

(U) The mission of the Fleet Intelligence Center PACIFIC, as set forth in CINCPACFLTINST 5450.1L, is to develop an intelligence processing and production capability which is immediately available to support U. S. Naval Forces in the Pacific and Indian Ocean areas assigned to USPACOM for defense responsibility; to provide those forces with the intelligence materials necessary to carry out efficiently their respective missions; to maintain sufficient qualified and trained intelligence personnel for assignment to peacetime and wartime augmentation requirements; to provide direct support and assistance to CINCPACFLT which will enable that command to fulfill its requirements for nuclear weapons employment and planning; and to perform such other functions as may be directed by CINCPACFLT.

(U) The organizational and departmental structure of FICPAC is illustrated in the organizational charts in Appendix I. Departmental functions and accomplishments are as follows:

(U) SUPPORT DEPARTMENT (1 DEPARTMENT). The Support Department provides services necessary for the planning and coordination of all matters relating to the general administration for the command. The department is comprised of the Graphics Division (11), Administrative/Security Division (13), Supply Division (15), Resources Management/Budget Division (1B), and the First Lieutenant/Maintenance Division (1C).

(U) SPECIAL SECURITY OFFICE (001). The SSO advises and assists the Commanding Officer of FICPAC in his responsibilities pertaining to the administration and control of sensitive compartmented information (SCI) materials and billets. The SSO also supports the Intelligence Production Department through the distribution and control of SCI materials and imagery and provides limited assistance to COMSUBPAC and major afloat commands.

The FICPAC SSO currently controls over 3000 SCI documents, 177 active SCI billets, 20 ACDUTRA billets (filled by 180 reservists over a twelve-month period), three years of stored and cataloged overhead imagery (1981-1983), and numerous special files. The SSO also has responsibility for the security of FICPAC's two separate SCIF's (rooms 101 and 101A on the first deck, and rooms 306 and 312 on the third deck).

During 1983, the SSO handled approximately 1,000 outgoing messages; shipped over 8,000 pounds of ARFCOS material; and received, routed, and controlled in excess of 80,000 messages and 15,000 pounds of ARFCOS material. This included over 135,000 frames of imagery in various formats.

(U) NAVAL RESERVE OFFICE (01R). The Reserve Liaison Office is a part of the Executive Department of Fleet Intelligence Center Pacific (FICPAC), Pearl Harbor, HI. The Reserve Liaison Office manages and carries out the administration for the reserve program at FICPAC, which involves 613 reserve mobilization billets divided among 14 Fleet Intelligence Rapid Support Teams Pacific (FIRSTPAC) units located at 7 different drill sites throughout the western continental United States. This program includes the annual reporting to FICPAC of 250 reservists, each for a two-week period of Active Duty for Training (ACDUTRA). A part of the Naval Reserve Intelligence Program (NRIP), FICPAC's reserve program is the second largest in the NRIP. Out of 29 active duty intelligence commands, having reserve intelligence units, only Fleet Intelligence Center Europe and Atlantic (FICEURLANT) at Norfolk, Virginia, has a larger reserve intelligence program. FIRSTPAC's involvement in FICPAC production accounts for 26.8% of the command's total intelligence production manhours.
